On a cool, but pleasant, Friday the 15th
 of March, 1985, Jack Walter Peltason was in-
 augurated as the second Chancellor of UCI.
 The event was well-attended, featuring repre-
 sentation from sister institutions, the Board
 of Regents, Alumni, Staff, Faculty, and Stu-
 dents.

The long procession of academic leaders
 in their caps and gowns made an impressive
 sight as it wound its way through Aldrich Park
 and the assembled crowd. Prominent among them
 was Derek Bob, President of Harvard Univer-
 sity, who gave a talk on the roles and choices
 facing today's University administrator.

President Gardner of the University of
 California handled the brief investiture
 ceremony. The dignity of the occasion was
 lightened when President Gardner told the
 Chancellor that it was his last chance to
 withdraw. "Now he tells me", quipped Dr.
 Peltason.

Chancellor Peltason's Inaugural address
 dealt with UCI as it would be seen twenty
 years from now. The school, in his eyes,
 will be larger, but it will retain the same
 spirit of learning. And, yes, the Graduate
 School of Management received mention.

Thus assured that GSM has a role to
 play in UCI's future, this writer attended
 the postinaugural reception in the Humanities
 Plaza. Certainly, all who witnessed this
 ceremony will join us in saluting Chancellor
 Peltason and in wishing his tenure will be
 a long and successful one.
